Swap Meet – Ian KI6IES will be moving to the high desert. He will remain a member but February will be his last month as swap meet chair. A new chair is needed ASAP.

Public Service – A chairperson is needed.

Net – Frank K6FED will continue to coordinate Net activity. Contact Frank if you would like to take a turn as Net Control.

Old Business – John K6JGY spoke about what was needed to link our two repeaters. He estimated a cost of \$2200 if all equipment is new, and suggested that some of our surplus equipment is sold to help fund the cost. John and Chuck AI6I told us that someone had anonymously donated radio equipment to the club on condition that some of it is put on eBay. This was done and the equipment was sold for \$537. Some of that money was used for shipping the Club-owned 2m duplexers for evaluation. A price quote for their repair is expected soon. Some members asked what the benefits to the Club are if the repeaters are linked. The reply was that the main advantage is greatly increased coverage, for emergencies and for our members in normal use. Liz WD9CKM said that any funds used for linking the repeaters should not be taken from our swap meet income or existing bank accounts.

New Business – Clint K6LCS said that the Space Station repeater is back in use, and that amateur satellite AO16 is now active.

Speaker – A presentation was given by Sandy Sue Taylor KD6HCI of the Baker to Vegas Challenge Cup Relay communications support services. 240 runners are expected this year on the 120 mile course, which has been modified this year. Among the many thousands of people involved, about 250 hams are involved in overall race communications, and as many as 600 hams will help the individual teams. Among their tasks will be checking in the runners at each stage, reporting their condition, keeping team captains informed, and assisting the photography crew. Sandy's team had 47 members last year. There will be a training session and a 44 page training manual available, but Sandy said that volunteers without experience will be given the opportunity to watch and learn during the race before starting their assignments. People that come together will be kept on the same shift to avoid transportation problems. Volunteers need to bring their own 2m or 2m/440 HT, a flashlight, and refreshments.
